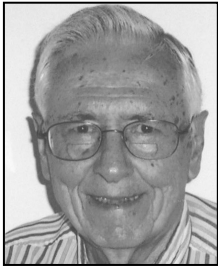

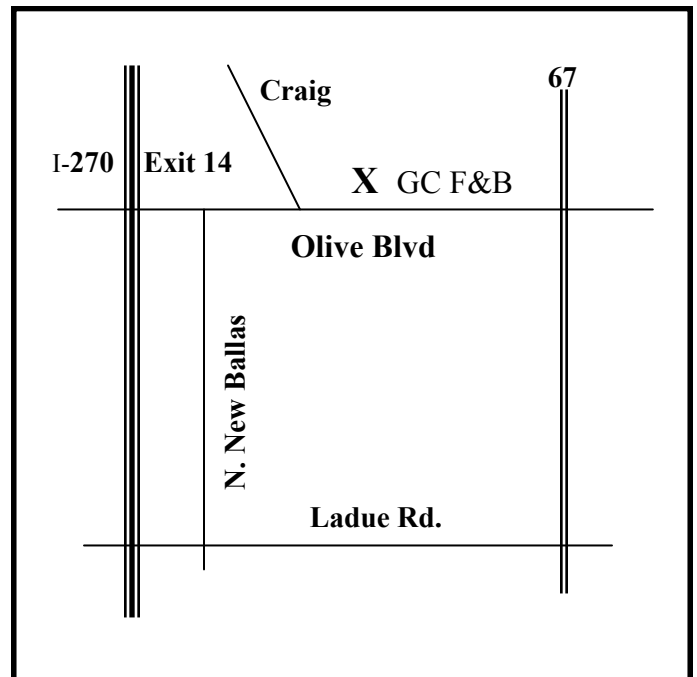

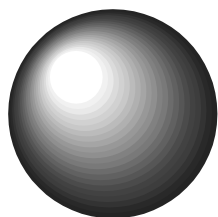

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Two-Thirds

The surface area of a sphere of radius r is equal to the lateral surface area of a cylinder circumscribing the sphere with radius r and height $2r$.

The surface area of a sphere is $2/3$ of the *total* surface area of its circumscribing cylinder.



The *lateral* surface of the circumscribing cylinder = $(2\pi r)(2r) = 4\pi r^2$ = the surface area of the sphere.

Height = $2r$

Length = $2\pi r$

Also, the volume of a sphere is $2/3$ of the volume of its circumscribing cylinder.

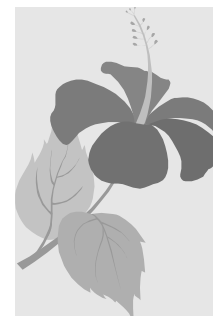

*Recruiting Science and Mathematics Career
Changers into Teaching*

Missouri is experiencing a shortage of science and mathematics teachers. The University of Missouri (MU) Science and Mathematics Academy for the Recruitment and Retention of Teachers (SMAR²T) recruits and prepares individuals who hold a baccalaureate degree in science, mathematics, or a related field (e.g., accounting, computer science, engineering, environmental science) to teach at the middle and/or secondary levels. SMAR²T provides two tracks: a 15-month program for full time post-baccalaureate students preparing to become teachers and a 24-month program for individuals who teach full time while they complete the program. \$10,000 Noyce Stipends, tuition waivers and other financial assistance is available.

Do you know someone who has an undergraduate degree in science or mathematics and would like to teach? Encourage them to learn more about SMAR²T at www.smar2t.missouri.edu, where they can find information on entrance requirements, financial support, programs of study, and application materials.
